Honor the LORD with your possessions, And with the firstfruits of all your increase; So your barns will be filled with plenty, And your vats will overflow with new wine.

#### Honor

- ▶ kâbêd, kaw-bade'; a prim. root; to be heavy, i.e. in a bad sense (burdensome, severe, dull) or in a good sense (numerous, rich, honorable); to make weighty (in the same two senses)
- ▶ to make honorable, honor, glorify

## Possessions (Wealth)

**hôwn**; wealth; by impl. enough:—enough, + for nought, riches, substance, wealth.

#### First Fruits

- ▶the first and best; first fruit, choicest portion
- ▶ firstfruit, i.e., the first portion of something which has been set aside in dedication and offering to God

### Increase (Produce/Crops)

- ►Income, i.e. produce (lit.) or fig.):—fruit, gain, increase, revenue.
- ▶ Yield, produce, crops, i.e., what is harvested from plants, whether grain or fruit (Ge 47:24; Dt 22:9); 2. LN 65.1–65.16 gain, income, i.e., what is valuable.

- ▶ It is God who makes increase possible
- ▶ The ingathering of increase was an occasion of celebration.
  - Festival of Unleavened Bread.
  - ► The Feast of Weeks (firstfruits of grain) was observed in May–June (Deut 16:9ff.).
  - ► Festival of Booths (Lev 23:39; cf. Deut 16:13ff.) The end-of-the-year harvest in October, chiefly a fruit harvest.

#### Worship

- One practical test of whether one is trusting the Lord or one's own judgment can be found in how we view our possessions and finances.
- ▶Today, this means giving to God the "first produce" of your paycheck, rather than waiting to give after all the bills have been paid.

### Promise of Prosperity - Barns

- Barn (אָסַם, asam', Prov. 3:10; "store-house," Deut. 28:8; ἀποθήκη, "barn" or "garner"), a place of deposit for grain.
  - ▶Only used in Proverbs 3:10 and Deuteronomy 28:8
- Filled Satisfaction, in general, signifies the act of giving complete or perfect pleasure.

#### Promise of Prosperity - Filled

- ► The notion of being full is satisfied and complete. Not gluttoned or greedy. Essentially, when you glorify God with your revenue i.e. worship God through giving (tithes and offerings) God will consecrate your storehouse or home.
- ► GIVE ME WHAT IS HOLY TO ME AND I WILL BLESS WHAT YOU HAVE!

### Promise of Prosperity - Plenty

- Plenty Overflowing (Excess a quantity much larger than needed)
  - (śābā') abundance, overflowing, i.e., a condition of plenty and more than enough

### Promise of Prosperity - Overflow

- Overflow Run over (breach)
  - ▶ What does it mean to breach?
  - מְּבְרַץ pârats, paw-rats'; a prim. root; to break out (in many applications, direct and indirect, lit. and fig.):—x abroad, (make a) breach, break (away, down, -er, forth, in, up), burst out come (spread) abroad, compel, disperse, grow, increase, open, press, scatter, urge
  - ▶ to make a split or breach; to break through, down, or out (51)

# Promise of Prosperity - Overflow

► The promise is that God will bless the work of your hands. You have to work to yield crops but God will honor the conditions for you to be plentiful in your work.

► There is a natural symmetry between gifts to God and the blessings that ensue. (Deut. 15:13-14; 28:8). Proverbs takes Israel's covenant faith as a given.
